

The George Naylor Award

The George Naylor Award is named for George Naylor, who was a member of Nentico Lodge for over 60 years. His efforts contributed to the opening of Broad Creek Memorial Scout Reservation and he became a member of Nentico Lodge during Broad Creek's second season in 1949. He immediately took to ceremonies work, teaching Indian Lore, handicraft and beadwork.

George Naylor kept his Vigil in 1959 being named Leppoewina – Cunning Man. It was also in 1959 that he crafted the beaded necklaces given to delegates attending the Area III-A Conference hosted by Nentico Lodge at Broad Creek. When the lodge chief asked him to create recognition to be presented to those Arrowmen who had made the conference a success, George created the Nentico Service Beads. He constructed hundreds of these highly prized necklaces over the next 40 years. Service Beads are still awarded by each Nentico Lodge Chief more than 65 years later.

Nentico Lodge Chiefs wore bonnets crafted by George Naylor for over 30 years. His beaded necklaces were gifts to dozens of past chiefs and his necklaces also identified the officers of Sections NE-6 and NE-4C. Nentico Lodge dedicated Arrow Bridge over Deep Run which leads to OA Hill at Broad Creek in his memory. George Naylor died in 2008.

The George Naylor Award honors the youth and adults who give exemplary service to the Order of the Arrow, Scouting and their community over an extended period of time. These Arrowmen are those who lead by their leadership and service, exemplify the ideals of the Order and are role models for other Arrowmen and Scouts, just like George Naylor.

The Lodge Key 3 will consider all Arrowmen recommended for the award and present the award to those most deserving. While there is no limit to the number of awards given in any year, the Key 3 may also decide that the award will not be presented for that year. If an honoree is selected, Nentico Lodge will contribute a sum of \$1,000 toward a James E West Fellowship Award in the name of each honoree.
